## Use network providers and pharmacies

With this plan, you have the freedom to enjoy nationwide access to care at innetwork costs when you visit any provider participating in the UnitedHealthcare ${ }^{\circledR}$ Medicare National Network (exclusions may apply). Plus, you have the flexibility to visit any provider nationwide who accepts Medicare. You may pay a higher copay or coinsurance when you see an out-of-network provider. If you use pharmacies that are not in our network, the plan may not pay for those drugs, or you may pay more than you pay at a network pharmacy.
